FROM THE PASTOR

God is with you all!

During the month of March, our spiritual village will continue to have conversation about the options for the long-term stewardship of our facility and property.

If you remember, the Council has presented three basic options for our consideration.

- Invest about \$1 million in our current facility (including about \$250,000 in a solar farm and about \$350,000 to bury our mortgage).
- Invest about \$2 million to demolish our current facility, build a new, right-sized facility, and bury the mortgage.
- Liquidate our valuable property, bury the mortgage, and relocate, building a new, right-sized facility in the new location, possibly with no fundraising except for bridge loans.

So far, we've had three formal listening posts about these options, in addition to many informal conversations. Whenever and wherever we gather for conversation, it's important that we keep the following context in mind:

- The ELCA has challenged us to think strategically about our congregation's future.
- Fewer people are participating in congregation-based religion nowadays.
- Fewer young people than ever are participating in conareaation-based religion.
- Patterns of attendance are changing among faithful members of congregations.
- Denominational congregations have targeted or limited
- Lutherans have many congregations in our area probably too many!
- Ascension is located on a church row of successful congregations, so there's very little cross-shopping (pun intended) going on.
- Ascension's primary service area is fairly low-density in terms of population.
- Ascension's fixed costs are fairly significant for a congregation our size.

Ascension's sanctuary service on Ash Wednesday is at 7:30 PM. This service is a non-Communion service, and includes the receiving of ashes on the forehead.



REPORT ON HARMONY MINISTRIES MISSION TRIP

On the recent mission trip to Harmony Ministries in Haiti we saw over 400 people in a health clinic at the Thoman mission and 500 at the LaSalle mission. Each family was prescribed medicines as needed, as well as vitamins, soap and a package of rice. We distributed children's vitamins to the school teachers at each location so over 500 children in Harmony Ministries schools will get a vitamin each day for at least the next two months. I am pleased to report that Ascension's \$2,170 contribution to this effort was gratefully received and faithfully used. Thank you. I also thought you might like to personally know several other things:

Pastor Luc told me the \$6,000 plus from Ascension that was sent to him in 2015 was received just as he was deciding whether they would have enough funds to begin rebuilding a school wing at Port au Prince that was destroyed in the 2010 earth quake. Our funds were used to build the foundation! The school is just about finished now and will be occupied in the fall of this year.

When we were there, a Harmony Ministries Mission Team was commissioned at the Port au Prince church. There were about 30-40 of them with matching tan polo shirts imprinted with "HMMT" (Harmony Ministries Mission Team). After church they were going to an orphanage for disabled children — 300 disabled children with all sorts of issues including deafness, blindness, deformities, various reasons to be in wheelchairs, etc. — to distribute rice and soap! Pastor Luc discovered the orphanage and Harmony now provides help as they are able. (BTW, there is a wheelchair ramp into the church in PAP; it's on the courtyard side.)

Pastor Luc has established another church and school where there was formerly neither. It is in Bertrand, Haiti, a rural village far up in the mountains above Thoman (that is pretty remote itself). It is only accessible via donkey path that is a 3 hour round trip walking from Thoman. There is no building yet and both meet under a large Mango tree. There are 68 students and 2 teachers presently.

As you can see Pastor Luc is a pretty special "envoy from God". I hope Ascension can continue to support his ministry whether or not I am still around our congregation. -Submitted by Roy Gust

plans. It is 100% funded by private donations and is the only free mobile primary care clinic in Maricopa County. Three dollars of every coffee purchase will help to provide glucose test strips for diabetic patients (an essential need to help them manage their disease) – normally an out-

of-pocket cost of \$100 per month. Through your coffee purchases, you will be supporting <u>TWO</u> ministries for the price of one! Check out the Fair Trade coffee display at the back of the sanctuary. Also available by order, with the same global and local impact: baking cocoa, Fair Trade Equal Exchange chocolate and all occasion artisan gift items.

Easter gift bags will be again be for sale along with fair trade coffee prior to Easter. The gift bags are a fundraiser for Pocket Pal Quilts.

Part-time custodian

The custodian will provide for the satisfactory appearance and maintenance of the church building, equipment, and grounds, giving special attention to general neatness and cleanliness. A complete job description is available by request.

Weekly schedule: Part-time; four hours weekly Compensation: \$16.00 per hour for 2017.

Part-time assistant administrator

The assistant administrator will provide redundancy in knowledge and execution of office functions, finance, facility operations, and campus maintenance. The assistant administrator helps to create an open, accepting atmosphere for all who interact with the office; works closely with members to keep lines of communication open between office and congregation; teams with Parish Administrator to help ensure situations and tasks are handled promptly and effectively.
