God is with you all!

Alleluia! Christ is risen, my friends!

Let me begin by saying **thank you!** Thank you for the time and energy you invested in Ascension's observance of Holy Week and Easter. Thank you to our administrator, Tom, and our office volunteers, Carol and Tina, for your hard work and attention to detail in preparing us for worship. Thank you to our choirmaster, Dr. Samuel, to our organist, Dale, and to our choir for adding so much beauty to our proclamation of the good news. Thank you to Karen Brown and her Easter bunnies for helping us to pull off our annual egg hunt. And thank you to all of you for participating the way you did and for inviting people to be a part of our Resurrection celebration.

I'd like to take some space here to bring you all up to date on the results of our **special congregational meeting** on Sunday, March 26.

You will remember that I had called the meeting in order for the congregation to give our Council some sense of the congregation's preference for the long-term stewardship of our facility and property. Last fall, **three options** were presented to the congregation. The first option was to make an initial investment of \$1 million in our current facility. The second option was to raise \$2 million to replace our facility with a new, right-sized facility on our property. The third option was to sell our property and build a new, right-sized facility in a new location. Over the course of the fall and winter, we hosted several formal listening posts so that members could weigh the options. We also had many less formal conversations.

At the meeting, I asked folks to rank the three options. 50 of the voting members present indicated that they preferred option one. 14 of the voting members preferred option two. 26 voting members preferred option three. When we looked at what the second choice was among the folks who had selected option two, option one got an additional 5 votes and option three got an additional 9 votes. That means that option one was the first or second choice of more than **60% of the voting members** present.

In accordance with the sense of our voting members, our Council will be assembling a special **task force** to oversee the execution of option one. As I mentioned at the meeting, if a significant, specific opportunity for one of the other options comes our way, then the congregation will still get the chance to consider that offer all on its own.

FROM THE DEACON'S STUDY

STANDING FOR WELCOME: At the beginning of April, Connie Phillips (CEO, Lutheran Social Services of the Southwest) and Deacon Jayne went to the U.S. Capitol to visit our congress to support welcoming and compassionate refugee policies. We attended a Lutheran prayer breakfast in the famous Kennedy Caucus Room and met with the staffers of Senator McCain, Senator Flake, Representative Biggs and Representative Franks. Attending this Lutheran Hill visit were 90 Lutheran Bishops and our Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton.

I was honored to accompany Rabbi John Linder and six other members of Temple Solel to the **Kino Border Initiative** in Nogales, Mexico—a Jesuit led center of refuge and safety for deportees from the United States. Food, clothing, medical care and temporary shelter are provided for those dropped into Nogales by the U.S. Border Patrol. I was witness to the living Jesus among all who were present as bleeding feet were washed, wounds were bandaged, the horribly despondent were supported and the hungry were fed.

Of the many items needed for the people served at the Kino Boarder initiative, backpacks are of paramount so that the detainees can have something in which to carry their belongings that don't identify themselves as people deported from the U.S. (Carrying the clear plastic bags they are given at the detention centers put them at high risk as they are often held for ransom by the roaming gangs in Nogales)

I will be asking for **donations** of solid colored backpacks—dark blue or black in the coming weeks. I will be certain to get them where they are needed.



The first **Interfaith Seder** was held April 9 at Temple Solel with a good attendance from Ascension. A luncheon consisting of a huge table of kosher dishes and a separate dessert table was enjoyed by all—(especially the desserts!) We are so grateful for the partnership of Solel, as



they continue to bring diverse faith traditions together for greater understanding.

Ascension has a position available for a part-time Assistant Administrator.
